DETERMINING WHAT IS APPLICABLE TO YOUR OPERATION

In order to determine which sections of the SFCR apply to your operation, we have streamlined the Timetable for Dairy from the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) website. This enables you to decide which applies to your situation, as the requirements are very specific to the activities conducted at your operation. For example, if the only activity you do is sell dairy products at retail, then you only require traceability; you would then proceed directly to the Traceability section in this guide.

COMMODITY SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS: PART 6, DIVISION 2 OF THE SFCR

Division 2: Dairy Products

Requirements: 58. This division sets out the additional requirements for any raw milk or raw cream used in preparing a dairy product sent or conveyed from one province to another or exported which must meet the applicable requirements of the legislation of the province where the dairy product is prepared.
